VGA Testing Information for Grades 3-5

Beginning in 2021-22, the Virginia General Assembly enacted new testing requirements for all students in grades 3-8. The legislation calls for the administration of a fall and mid-year assessment and a spring assessment (SOL) in grades 3-8 in reading and mathematics to measure growth.

These assessments will serve as a baseline and not be considered "high stakes" tests. **The Growth Assessments** will not report a performance level showing whether a student "passed or failed" the assessment. Instead, the data will report how the student performed on each of the items included on the test.

Please note:

The Fall 2023 Growth Assessments will primarily measure reading and mathematics content from the student's previous grade level. For example, students enrolled in grade 5 mathematics in fall 2023 will take growth assessments based on grade 4 mathematics content.

This is a change from the **Fall 2022 Growth Assessments** where students were assessed on reading and mathematics content primarily from their **current grade level** - content they had not yet been taught.

The change in content measured by the **Fall 2023 Growth Assessments** is intended to ensure that teachers, parents, and students receive feedback on how well a student has mastered content that may be needed for success in the coming school year and to identify areas where a student may need additional support.

These online tests will be administered at your child's home school using a secure connection. Students receiving instruction virtually are required to participate as are students being served in contract services and those receiving homebound services.

Students must bring their iPads **fully charged each day**. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact your student's teacher.

Want to Chaperone on Field Trips? Help in Classrooms? Fill Out the Volunteer Form!

If you are interested in volunteering in a Montessori classroom or for MPSA/PTA activities both on and off campus, or being a chaperone for any field trips, you will need to complete the **Volunteer Application form**. You will be required to upload a legal and current drivers' license, state ID or military ID and must complete a 30-minute virtual training about sexual misconduct. You will be screened against the sex offender registry as well. To apply click here. (La aplicación en español está aquí.)

This year, any applications that have been assigned training that isn't completed within 30 days will be deleted and you will need to reapply.

All clearances are good for **three years** and across all of APS, regardless of which school you were originally registered at. If you are unsure of whether you are still clear or have any questions, e-mail <u>Kia</u> Haynes in the main office.

You do not have to be an approved volunteer to attend classroom celebrations, school programming or events.

Chaperones who are driving children: If you are a chaperone who will be driving students on a field trip, you will need to have completed the volunteer process, and provide to the coordinator a copy of your current license and proof of automobile insurance. You will also be required to fill out an APS driving chaperone form. APS employees: You cannot drive students other than your own child, regardless of having parent permission to do so, for school activities since being a representative of APS holds the district liable should an accident occur.

Music Programs at MPSA: Sign Up & How to Obtain an Instrument

For 4th and 5th grade students ONLY

If your child is interested in expanding their musical knowledge, now is the time to sign up for next year's music programs! Music provides an outlet for creativity and expression, boost academic performance, teach valuable life skills, and is a source of joy and community building. These are the music programs we offer here at MPSA:

- Band: Woodwind, brass and percussion instruments
- Orchestra: Strings (violins, violas, cellos, and upright double basses)
- Choir: Vocal music

Students may choose choir and/or **ONE** of either band or orchestra. If your child signed up at the end of the last school year, we have them recorded. However, feel free to fill this out again if unsure.

How to Obtain an Instrument

There are four basic ways to obtain an instrument (assuming you don't have one already.)

1. Rent one from a local music store. Many students use Foxes Music Co. in Falls Church www.foxesmusic.com or Music and Arts who have stores in Alexandria and McLean. Here is a link to Music and Arts rental page:

2. **Rent an instrument from APS.** Our instruments must be offered first to families who may not be able to afford to rent from a store. For students whose families qualify for reduced lunch the cost is only \$25 for the year. Any instruments still available after student in financial need have been served will be rented to any other family at a cost of \$100 for the year. To request a school instrument please fill out

the Rental Agreement in this link https://forms.gle/gbXGChR9s97hXUfv7 and send a check for the appropriate rental fee made out to **Montessori Public School of Arlington**

- 3. **Purchase your own instrument.** This is not recommended for students this age as they may need to experiment and experience a few different instruments before one clicks with them. Also, please check with your child's music teacher before buying anything. There are many brands of instrument out there that look like a great deal, but they end up being very poor quality and will be frustrating for your child to learn on. Students with poor quality instruments usually end up renting a quality instrument later in the year after their own falls apart.
- 4. Use an instrument that someone in your family or friend group offers to loan/give you. This is absolutely fine as long as the instrument is a quality instrument, and it is in good repair. Beware that even good quality instruments that have been sitting in someone's basement or attic may need significant work done to it to be played.

Students should aim to have their instruments by September 25th – the latest by October 2nd.


5th Grade Outdoor Lab Survey Results
