Weather and Outdoor Lunch/Recess

Colder temperatures are here! The Virginia Department of Education requires schools to allow children to have outdoor recess and activities if the weather is not dangerously hot or cold.

- Temperatures between 15- and 30-degrees Fahrenheit result in a shortened recess, meaning students should not be outside more than 15 minutes at a time.
- Temperatures below 15 degrees Fahrenheit mean that it's dangerously cold and children should not go outside at all.

We understand that some families may be fine with their children going outside for longer lengths of time than listed, however, we are required to follow policy.

Please remember to send your child to school with appropriate clothing for the weather. Hats, coats and gloves or mittens, please, and we are suggesting your child dress in layers so they can remove or add clothing if they get warm or cold while indoors.

If providing these items is a hardship for your family, please do not hesitate to reach out to our school social worker, **Kristin Decker**. She will help secure winter clothing for your child. She will be discreet.

SEL Update

Each month at MPSA we focus on **Social Emotional Learning (SEL)** in a variety of ways. One way we support student to student and teacher to student relationships each day is through the morning or afternoon meeting. Meetings are based on Montessori methods and Responsive Classroom methods. Our counseling team also introduces lessons for teachers to use each month based on both the Second Step curriculum and the Playbook lessons found in Panaroma Education to support classroom SEL. The counseling lesson to be presented to staff in late November is called the Resilience Tree.

Staff also share SEL practices they are using in their classrooms at monthly staff meetings. This past month Ms. Ross shared an Actor's Toolbox's technique. She and her class modified this technique which she uses to support student concentration and focus. Ms. Shaw our ITC presented a Sound Bath to the staff to support stress reduction, emotional-regulation, and self-awareness. This encompassed her playing an octave of crystal sound bowls which produce vibrations believed to synchronize brainwaves, promoting a sense of calmness, and reducing anxiety or tension. Additionally, Ms. Shaw presented a new Nearpod app to staff to support both staff and students in taking care of their emotional health.

Along with these SEL practices and professional development opportunities is another school wide initiative using an App called Flocabulary that supports children in different aspects of their social emotional development using rap songs. Each month there is a school wide SEL theme supported by a Flocabulary song. For November and December, the themes are Managing Worry and Stress and Conflict Resolution. The November and December school-wide Flocabulary songs will begin with: Managing Worry K-3, Managing Frustration K-1, and Managing Stress 6-12 (for upper EL).

Middle School Reminders for 5th Grade Families

The Home Address Confirmation Process (HACP) began this week on November 27th. ALL 5th grade families are required to provide the school with a copy of your deed/lease and two current proofs of address to confirm your residency here in Arlington. Families who recently submitted renewed leases or updated A/B Forms in September/October are still required to send in the supporting documentation. Families who do not submit their documents by the deadline of January 26th will have their students and their siblings (regardless of which school they are attending) withdrawn from APS at the end of the year. All documents received will be researched and verified for validity.

Homeowners: Arlington County will provide you with a free copy of your deed. E-mail **Arlington County Land Records** at landrec@arlingtonva.us making the request, being sure to include your child's school and school ID# in the request for enrollment confirmation.

We Could Still Use Some Grocery Gift Cards and Clothing Items

Winter break is a fun time for most of us, but for some of our families, it's a time of stress because access to two hot meals a day will be missing for 10 days. It is for this reason that we are continuing our annual tradition of collecting **grocery store gift cards** to help keep our food-insecure families stocked up for the additional burden of having to provide 20 more meals per child during the break. At this time, we have identified 13 families who will need help this season. We anticipate more reaching out for help as the break gets closer. Our goal is to collect enough gift cards to supply each family with at least \$100 to supplement their food budget.

With that said, if you are willing to **donate** a **grocery store gift card** (or gift card to a store that has a grocery section, like Target or Walmart) please drop off to **Kia Haynes** in the main office. Please keep the denominations for each gift card small (\$25 or less) so we can more evenly divvy up the cards amongst our families. **A tip to get more bang for your donated buck:** Purchase gift cards from **Aldi's**, where the food quality is still great but for much less than a typical chain store.

We will also take cash donations. Those will go directly to our social worker, Kristin Decker, who will purchase the gift cards and provide receipts of purchase if you would like. We will not be issuing cash to any families. We need all gift cards in hand by December 11th. We humbly thank you in advance.
