Conveying Gratitude & Sharing Food Assistance Resources

We are pleased to share that the Adelola "Lola" Adeyiga Memorial Fund*, created in the memory of a beloved MPSA student, will be donating all the grocery store gift cards we are in need of to distribute to our Montessori families at risk of food insecurity during the upcoming winter break. We heartily thank Lola's parents, Lindsay and Adeleke Adeyiga, for choosing our annual grocery card drive as one of their charitable acts this year. 19 families identified by our counselor and social worker as being in severe need will be receiving a \$100 gift card to a local grocery store for supplementing their grocery budget.

As this year's winter break will be an especially long one, *lasting 16 days from start to finish*, with no access to schools for our free-and-reduced-lunch families to get breakfast and lunch, APS would like us to share the way families can find help supplementing their food supply. AFAC Holidays: Holiday turkeys and chickens are available only to families & individuals already enrolled for AFAC's usual grocery program. <u>Click here to find out how to enroll</u>.

- November 18 23: AFAC households will receive 1 whole frozen turkey the week (Mon-Sat) before Thanksgiving. AFAC is closed Thanksgiving Day only, open the usual schedule Mon, Tue, Wed, Fri, Sat.
- December 16 21: AFAC households will receive 1 whole frozen chicken the week (Mon-Sat) before Christmas. AFAC is closed Christmas day, Christmas Eve's evening distribution, New Years Day, and New Years Eve's evening distribution.

The AOEA owns and stewards the 226 acres of land students visit during 3rd, 5th and 7th grades. We also build and maintain the buildings – including the Animal Lab. We are thrilled that generations of Arlington students have benefitted from this strong partnership.

At the Outdoor Lab, students engage in hands-on STEM applications by applying what they learn in the traditional classroom to real life situations. The Outdoor Lab welcomes all APS families to visit and experience the Lab at our twice-yearly Open Houses.
